

¹⁵ Ever since I first heard of your strong faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for God's people everywhere, ¹⁶ I have not stopped thanking God for you. I pray for you constantly. Ephesians 1:15-16 NLT

A few years ago Dr. Nick Stinnett of the University of Nebraska conducted a group of studies called the "Family

Strengths Research Project". Stinnett and his researchers identified six qualities that make for strong families. The first quality and one of the most important to be found in strong families was the quality of <u>appreciation</u>. Families that are strong are strong in part, Dr. Stinnett concludes, because family members express to each other their appreciation for what the other members DO and for who they ARE.

In a similar study another researcher looked into the effect of <u>praise</u> in the workplace. His study showed that the ratio of praise to criticism in the workplace needs to be four to one before employees feel that there is a *balance* - that there must be <u>four times</u> as much praise as there is criticism before they feel good about their work and about the environment they work in.

That is pretty staggering information - information that tells us that if we want to do something good, that if we want to have a healthy family, a strong workplace, or any other effective group that we need to be sure that appreciation, praise, and thanksgiving are heard <u>at least four</u> times as often as is criticism.

In Hebrew, the word for gratitude - hoda'ah - is the same as the word for confession. To offer thanks is to confess dependence, to acknowledgment that others have the <u>power to benefit you</u>, to admit that <u>your life is better because of their efforts</u>. As we approach thanksgiving, may be especially aware of our debt to each other. Our lives are beautifully enriched by the gift of our friends, our family, our church and our fellow citizens. This Thanksgiving, take time to intentionally express your debt of appreciation to those who bless your life.



Pastor Flint opened the meeting with prayer.

The council discussed updating our church's pamphlet that we hand out to visitors. Pastor Flint will follow up on this project, and work with Mary Anderson to produce new pamphlets. Council members were encouraged to talk with their teams and make plans for goals to achieve for 2016. This information will be needed for our Annual Meeting in January. Pastor Flint would like each Ministry Coordinator to take a turn doing a two-minute talk during church services to inform the congregation about what each team does. We need more people interested in participating in teams.

The date for the Annual Meeting was proposed by Martin to be moved from January 17, 2016 to January 24, 2016. This would give the congregation more time to look over the reports ahead of the meeting. Cathy made a motion that the date be changed, Wally seconded it, the council voted, and the motion passed.

Tim O'Neill reported that our new electronic sign is in production. The sign will be delivered and installed by mid-December.

Wally reported that the ABW group has offered to donate \$1,000 for the purchase of new chairs for Fellowship Hall, if it is decided by the council that new chairs will be purchased. Wally has fixed a few chairs himself.

Paula Newell reported that as of November 15th, 35 written pledges have been received. We had 44 pledges last year. Paula is expecting that a few more pledges will still come in. The council reviewed the budget which is still being fine-tuned. The monthly Treasurer's Report is on display on the bulletin board on the wall across from the side of the Welcome Center.

Pastor Flint gave a closing prayer, and the meeting was adjourned.



Hanging of the Green


